- Movement of plant and Equipment
- Steel erection
- Placement of pre cast concrete (not tilt slab)
- Erection, reaving and dismantling of:
- Hoisting Equipment, winches, blocks and tackles
- Static lines and safety nets
- Mast climbers
- Perimeter safety screens and shutters – Cantilever crane L.P.
- Wire Rope Splicing

- Theory & Practical Exam
- Assessment to Nationally Licencing Standard is provided as part of the course

- Successful completion of Dogging
- Participants must provide identification and be 18 years of age or over and deemed Competent to be signed off for their National High Risk Work Licence

- Hard hat & safety footwear
